What Is Cancer?

Cancer is a group of diseases characterized by the uncontrolled growth and spread of abnormal cells. If the spread is not controlled, it can result in death.

Although the causes of cancer are not completely understood, numerous factors are known to increase the disease's occurrence, including many that are modifiable (e.g., tobacco use and excess body weight) and those that are not (e.g., inherited genetic mutations and immune conditions). These risk factors may act simultaneously or in sequence to initiate and/or promote cancer growth.

Can Cancer Be Prevented?

A substantial proportion of cancers could be prevented, including all cancers caused by tobacco use and other unhealthy behaviors. According to a recent study by American Cancer Society researchers, at least 42% of newly diagnosed cancers in the US – about 740,000 cases in 2019 – are potentially avoidable, including the 19% of all cancers that are caused by smoking and the 18% that are caused by a combination of excess body weight, physical inactivity, excess alcohol consumption, and poor nutrition. Certain cancers caused by infectious agents, such as human papillomavirus (HPV), hepatitis B virus (HBV), hepatitis C virus (HCV), and *Helicobacter pylori* (*H. pylori*), could be prevented through behavioral changes or vaccination to avoid the infection, or treatment of the infection. Many of the more than 5 million skin cancer cases that are diagnosed annually could be prevented by protecting skin from excessive sun exposure and not using indoor tanning devices.

Screening can help prevent colorectal and cervical cancers by detecting precancerous lesions that can be removed. It can also detect some cancers early, when treatment is more often successful. Screening is known to help reduce mortality for cancers of the breast, colon, rectum, cervix, prostate, and lung (among current or former heavy smokers). In addition, a heightened awareness of changes in certain parts of the body, such as the breast, skin, mouth, eyes, or genitalia, may also result in the early detection of cancer.

The Fraternal Order of Eagles has been helping with the fight against this horrible disease since 1944. Your donations have helped with the advancement of treatments and research for cures. State President Mike Clepper has chosen the Cancer Fund as his Charity this year, as the Pa. State Charity Chairman for the Cancer Fund, I urge all Aeries & Brothers to continue with their efforts to raise funds to find a cure. 2020 F.O.E. STATE BOWLING TOURNAMENT RULES

- This is a USBC moral sanctioned tournament. All bowlers must be a member of a Pennsylvania Aerie or Auxiliary of the Fraternal Order of Eagles and in good standings at the time of tournament bowling. Membership cards will be checked.
- 2. The tournament will consist of team, doubles, and singles events and will be handicap. Handicap will be 100% of the difference between entering average and 220. Handicap will be computed on a three (3) game series.
- 3. Entrants shall use their highest 2018-2019 season average of 21 or more games, unless current average at time of bowling is 10 pins or more higher, then current average must be used. Bowlers with no previous season average must use their current highest average at time of bowling (21 games or more). Any bowler without an average must bowl scratch.
- 4. Averages submitted by bowlers winning prize money will be certified and any bowler found to have submitted an incorrect average will forfeit all prize money. Individual bowlers are responsible for submitting correct average to the team captain. Team captains should send proof of averages along with the entry form.
- 5. Any and all scoring protests must be made in writing to the tournament committee within 36 hours after bowling.
- 6. Multiple participation is permitted in all three events but a bowler may cash only once in singles and once in doubles with the same partner. Teams may cash more than once provided they have changed at least 2 bowlers. The first score in each event will be used for the all events score.
- 7. All prize money will be returned 100%. Prize money will be paid at a ratio of at least 1 in 8 in each event.
