



Zucchini Garlic Bites

1 cup zucchini grated and drained well
 1 egg
 1/3 cup breadcrumbs
 1/4 parmesan grated cheese
 1 clove garlic grated fine
 2 tablespoons fresh chives chopped
 1 tablespoon fresh parsley chopped
 1 teaspoon fresh basil chopped
 1 teaspoon fresh oregano chopped
 pinch of salt and pepper
 tomato sauce for dipping

Instructions

Preheat oven to 400°F. lightly coat a baking sheet with olive oil or non-stick spray Set aside
 Use a box grater to grate the Zucchini into a clean towel. Roll up the towel and twist to wring out the moisture. Grate the garlic using the small holes on the box grater.
 In a medium bowl, combine all the ingredients and mix well
 Shape a tablespoon of the mixture into your hands, pat into small balls, and place on baking sheet.
 Bake for 15-18 minutes in the preheated oven till golden brown.
 Serve warm with marinara sauce.
 Recipe makes about 16 bites
