MEMBERSHIP REPORT- October 2021

September starts a new beginning for many as the kids are back in school, Aeries get busier with activity as Fall and Winter approach. Our members are at the Aerie homes more. My messages will NOT focus on where The PA State President and I went during the month and everyone we visited. They will focus more on how to grow membership.

One of the biggest challenges we face is increasing membership. It is hard to know how to do it. We often do not really review what ways help and what ways are a bust. When you look at examples of how our organization and others have attracted members you see great success in many examples.

GET HELP FROM CURRENT MEMBERS:

1. Host a "bring a friend" meeting Encourage members to bring someone. This could even be a recurring event so that new members are continually bringing new friends!
2. Reach out to former members Some people might be ready to come back. Write them a letter and waive re-enroll fees.
3. Encourage members to share your newsletter
4. Invite members' families to events Spouses, siblings, parents, and (grown-up) children are all potential members. Try to have a family friendly event.
5. Help members develop an a "speech" about their membership Why are they members? What's the biggest benefit of membership? Can they explain the purpose of the club?
6. Ask your members for recruitment ideas They may have an idea you haven't thought of before or know about opportunities within their own social networks.
7. Offer an alternate meeting time to attract people with different schedules Is your meeting time leaving out a whole group of people, like those with 9-5 jobs or early bedtimes? Switch up your offerings to attract more people.
13. Conduct exit interviews with departing members When you know why people are leaving, you can start figuring out ways to keep them. Try to save all members that are leaving by having a committee call them on the phone.
14. Create perks for club members who recruit new members Little perks and freebies can really motivate people. Think about gift certificates, a shout-out at your next meeting, or even reserving a coveted parking space for members who bring in new blood.
15. Use digital and social media to attract members.
16. Put a float in a parade. Have your name on the float. These are just a few ideas to consider. One year my Aerie added over 60 re-enrolled members by simply sending a letter an application and asking them to join again. We signed them in quickly and are happy they are back. Please share these ideas with members. ASK SOMEONE TO JOIN TODAY.

Reminder that your 990 for Year Ending May 31

You must have a 990 filed for the most recent fraternal year ending May 31. If all extensions were filed, deadline is April 15. All extensions must be submitted to the Grand Aerie Compliance Department.

The local Aerie and Auxiliary 990's are due October 15 with the IRS. The IRS does not have the Grand Aerie classification updated at all of their tax return centers. The Grand Aerie classification was changed from a 501(c)10 to a 501(c)8 in 2007.

All 990 returns should include a copy of the April 5, 2007 IRS Determination Letter. This will avoid local returns being rejected.

House Rules Approved By Grand Aerie

All Aeries & Auxiliaries, per Section 122.4 of the Grand Aerie Constitution & Statutes and Rules & Regulations, must have their House Rules submitted to the Grand Secretary's Office for approval. Those who have yet to submit their House Rules or whose House Rules have been rejected will be considered out of compliance until their House Rules are properly approved. Any House Rules posted which have not been approved are NOT ENFORCEABLE.

Bond or Employee Dishonesty Coverage

Your policy MUST include bond or employee dishonesty coverage in order to be considered in compliance with the Grand Aerie.

Liquor Liability Insurance

Obtaining Liquor Liability Coverage protects you in the event a patron causes property damage, physical damage to another individual or causes harm via a motor vehicle after being served at your establishment. A select number of states do not have dram shop laws, which means the establishment cannot be held responsible for the actions of an individual served there. In these states (Delaware, Kansas, Louisiana, Maryland, Nebraska, Nevada, South Dakota and Virginia) it is not required for an Aerie to obtain Liquor Liability Insurance.

General Liability Insurance

You must submit the entire General Liability Insurance policy for the Aerie and Auxiliary with the Grand Aerie Fraternal Order of Eagles named as Additionally Insured. Auxiliary must either be a policy owner on the Aerie's policy or have their own separate policy.

Bond or Employee Dishonesty Coverage

Your policy MUST include bond or employee dishonesty coverage in order to be considered in compliance with the Grand Aerie.

Signed Affiliation Agreement

As some of you may know, the Grand Aerie and some local Aeries have been found liable in recent lawsuits, costing the organization in dollars, valuable membership and leadership and adding additional stress and frustration which inhibits our ability to grow. With these situations and the protection of our members in mind, our legal team drafted the Affiliation Agreement. The Agreement provides protection to local members, officers, their buildings and property, as well as the Grand Aerie, and provides us with a valuable resource to guide decision-making on all levels.

The Worthy President and Secretary of the Aerie are required to sign the Affiliation Agreement and send it back to the Grand Aerie Office to the attention of the Compliance Administrator. Once received, a Grand Aerie official will also sign the agreement and send a copy back to your Aerie for record keeping purposes. The Affiliation Agreement is located in the MMS Admin section of the Member Management System (MMS) for your review and signature.

Further, the Affiliation Agreement requires each Aerie to enter into a similar agreement with each of its Auxiliaries, clubs within a club (such as REAC, Eagle Riders, etc.), and any other subordinate groups. A sample agreement has also been placed in the reports section of MMS for your reference. Please note the waiver on the first page of the agreement. Due to the variations in the laws across the United States, we cannot give each Aerie a finalized form to use, but we wanted to at least give an example of what the agreement between your Aerie and its associated groups could look like.

EAGLE VILLAGE

Dwaine Shupe, Pa State Secretary has asked me to be the Eastern Regional Chairman of the Eagle Village Charity.

Eagle Village was launched in February of 1961 in Bradenton, Florida. In the beginning there were fourteen cottages for Eagle members who were at least sixty (60) years of age and been an Eagle member for at least twenty-five (25) years. Sixty years later there are eighty five (85) cottages and the minimum age requirement has been reduced to fifty-five (55) years of age and you must have been a member for at least ten (10) years. You must be retired.

Eagle Village is a nice quiet community for Eagle members to retire. There is a library, a town hall, offices, an archive room, a large swimming pool, and a brand new recreational facility which opened in February of 2019, shuffleboard courts, and a three acre lake. The average rent is \$550.00 per month. Demands are now being placed on Eagle Village for further development to serve the increased demand for people who want to become residents of Eagle Village.

Over the years Eagle Village has been fortunate enough to receive donations from Provincial and local Aeries and Auxiliaries as well as from individual members. I am encouraging all Aeries and Auxiliaries to run some fund raisers for Eagle Village to help our retirement village to expand and keep making improvements to our existing village. There is at least a five (5) year waiting list to become a resident of Eagle Village so if you think that you may want to retire there in a few years you should put your name on the waiting list now. If you later change your mind, you may remove you name from the list.

There are five (5) units that may be rented during the year for a maximum of two (2) week period during the year for \$400.00 per week.

Automobile Travel:

Carlisle is at the intersection of three major highways: Interstate 81, the Pennsylvania Turnpike (Interstate 76) and U.S. Rt. 11. Please see the following detailed driving instructions for routes from those thoroughfares to USAHEC/USAMHI.

Air:

The nearest commercial airport is Harrisburg International Airport (HIA), located south of Harrisburg adjacent to the Pennsylvania Turnpike (I-76). It is approximately 28 miles from Carlisle.

Other public transportation:

Carlisle is served by a local bus line (Capital Area Transit, CAT). There is no public transportation within Carlisle or to/from HIA. Taxis are available for local use. Amtrak trains share the Harrisburg terminal with Greyhound and CAT. That terminal is 19 miles from Carlisle Barracks.


