GRANTS

Grants from the various funds of the F.O.E. Charity Foundation are made available every year to 501 (c) 3 organizations. Grants may only be given to non-profit institutions, as dictated under the Articles of Incorporation of the Eagles and must conform to IRS requirements for non-profit institutions. Grants are paid directly to recipients for such purposes as stated in the Charity By-laws. Qualifying organizations include but are not limited to local hospitals, universities, camps, clinics. Exceptions to this rule include the Children's Christmas Shopping Sprees and H.O.M.E.

Fund Grants. Grants must be for research, education, equipment or supplies and can be anywhere from \$500-\$5,000 for grants requested by States/Provinces and \$6,000-\$10,000 for special charity projects.

- ♣ Children's Fund grants can only go to establishments and/or institutions caring for and/or treating mentally and physically impaired children (under the age of 18) and to hospitals treating children or researching the diseases of children.
- ♣ The Drug Awareness grant is a matching grant up to a maximum of \$1,000 (which includes the Aerie/Auxiliary contribution of \$100 to \$500.)
- ♣ C.P.R. grants are only awarded to local Fire Departments or Emergency Medical Service units. Funds are to be utilized for CPR equipment. Grant money cannot be used to pay for any class instructor training fees associated with holding a class in CPR.
- ♣ The Golden Age Fund grant is to aid charitable organizations sponsoring community oriented programs for the elderly. A grant cannot go to an individual, an Aerie as a club, private nursing home, etc.

Grant requests are submitted by Aeries and Auxiliaries to the State/Provincial Executive Board. Each State/Province has approving authority for grants. All submission of grants must go through the State/Provincial entities.

If you are an outside organization seeking funding from Fraternal Order of Eagles charities, please contact a local chapter with your request. Grants submitted directly to the Grand Aerie will be returned.

The F.O.E. Charity Foundation does not approve grants to outside fund raising organizations such as the American Diabetes Association, National Kidney Foundation or Association, American Cancer Society, National Heart Association, National Alzheimer's Association or to an individual, or an Aerie as a club.

Grants cannot be used for salaries, administrative costs or for any continuing education classes

Mother's Day Lives On

Thanks To PGWP Frank E. Hering

For more than a century, the second Sunday in May has been set aside to honor mothers everywhere - and it all started with a push from the Fraternal Order of Eagles. On February 7, 1904, Fraternal Order of Eagles Past Grand Worthy President Frank E. Hering made a public plea to recognize mother's everywhere. A decade later, President Woodrow Wilson signed a proclamation making Mother's Day a reality.

The achievement remains one of the most significant milestones in the history of the organization. From preparing brunch to buying cards and flowers, the spirit of Hering and the F.O.E. lives on through our actions each Mother's Day.

While the F.O.E. continues to celebrate and take pride in the creation of Mother's Day, many citizens are unaware of the organization's work toward making the holiday a reality.

Hering, a faculty member at the University of Notre Dame, found inspiration for the holiday when he stumbled upon a classroom of students preparing postcards to send home to their mothers. The generous task inspired him to create a day specifically for honoring and recognizing mothers.

Serving as Grand Worthy President in 1909 and 1911, Hering used his position of influence to spread his idea for Mother's Day. Soon the enthusiasm swelled throughout the organization and Eagles across the country were eager to see their dream become a reality.

Aeries began hosting their own celebrations to honor mothers and finally their hard work paid off as President Wilson designated May 10, 1914, the first Mother's Day. Several organizations have stepped forward in an attempt to take credit for the holiday, but documented evidence shows that Hering - and the Eagles - were the true founders of Mother's Day.

In 1925, the Society of War Mothers introduced Hering as "The Father of Mother's Day" before an audience of Congressmen at the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier cementing his legacy - and that of the Eagles - as the founder of Mother's Day.

As we celebrate another Mother's Day more than 100 years after Wilson officially recognized the Eagles' work, we ask citizens everywhere to honor the important women in their lives and remember the passion and dedication an organization shared with the world to make it all possible.

I would like to say Thank You to everyone who came to the Testimonial. It was a great to see everyone again. Jeremy and I would like to say Thank You for supporting us this year. Jeremy received money for the Boy Scout Camp and I received of \$7,000.00. All I could say is that I got my one dog (LOL I was repeating that all night). My charity was wounded warrior canine unit, to get service dogs for veterans that need one. As of the testimonial I have enough funds raised to get a second dog. 60/40 split for clubs with small games of chance

There is a lot of confusion on this. It was extended, but the General Assembly passed a referendum that the voters adopted on May 18, and a subsequent resolution ended the declaration on June 21, 2021, starting the one year

We understand that the regulatory extensions in HB 854, which passed BEFORE the resolution, do not apply to SGOC.

We have not been able to get the House and Senate to agree to extend it again yet, though bills have been introduced. As you know, Senator Regan has been unwilling to let us pass our six packs bill. Maybe he can help push an extension for SGOC.

Late last week, we were notified by our billing partner that the Dues Reminders have yet to be mailed because a National paper shortage has left them without the standard mail envelopes needed for the mailing.
